



### International Letter of Introduction Eligibility

Eligible	NOT Eligible
<p>(1) When a member is planning to <b>attend</b> a local Scouting event or activity and all information for the event is supplied (including dates and venue) and the contact details of the event organiser are provided; or</p> <p>(2) When a member is planning to <b>visit</b> a local Scout Group and the date and location of the visit are confirmed, and the contact details for the Group Leader or Leader in Charge are provided.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Private holiday – even if there is a “chance” of meeting Scouts.</li><li>• Travel to Scouting properties on a personal itinerary – including but not limited to Brownsea Island, Gilwell Park, Baden-Powell House, Kandersteg International Scout Centre, Philmont Scout Ranch.</li><li>• Visit to the National Scout Headquarters or Scout Shop or Scout Museum of any other country.</li><li>• Attendance at a public visitors day of any overseas Scouting event. (As distinct from being a registered <b>attendee</b> of the event that is fully participating in the event program.)</li><li>• Representing Scouts Australia at an overseas meeting or other function. (These must be registered separately as a dedicated event in the OLEMS database.)</li><li>• Representing Scouts Australia as an approved member of an Australian Contingent or Branch Friendship Tour. (Contingent registration replaces the requirement for an International Letter of Introduction).</li></ul>

The cost of the International Letter of Introduction (including two Australian scarves and delivery) is \$50.
