- Make sure that the items that could be bad for the environment (chemicals etc.) in your Scout Group's storage room are labelled clearly
- Talk with an expert about what the effects of a changing climate would be to you
- Start a recycling program in your local area
- Work with your Group Support Committee on ways you can implement solar for hotwater or electricity, or sourcing accredited 100% Green Power to power your scout hall
