



Biodiversity Checklist

Plan

- Find out what plants and animals are indigenous to your area (the council website may have some of this information)
- Make a list of animals that you observe in your area
- Check local council website for grants that could be used to plant indigenous habitat gardens
- Meet with local council or friends' groups to share their plans improving biodiversity
- Plan how you can improve biodiversity around your hall or campsite
- Plan a vegetable or herb garden that can provide fresh food for activities in your hall or on camp
- Organise an information session for all members of the group and/or send out information

Do

- Grow indigenous seeds and plants to plant around your hall or in local areas
- Build nest boxes, frog bog, insect hotels, butterfly garden or place rocks and pipes that will help provide habitat for animals
- Connect with surrounding habitat
- Protect special trees
- Conduct information sessions for whole group

Review

- Conduct ongoing monitoring of animals that visit. Do you see different animals at different times of year? Are the plants different?
- Check in with members to see if they have suggestions for improvement
