



## Energy Checklist

### Plan

- List the types of energy used in your scout hall or camp – include electricity, gas, solar, firewood and transport fuel
- Calculate how much energy used – look at power bills (*check for firewood calorific value estimator weblink*)
- List the main ways energy is used in your scout hall or camp: heating and cooling, water heating, fridge and freezer, lighting, other appliances
- Check for grants that could be used to install solar panels and energy efficient LED light globes
- Write up a program for cleaning and servicing light fixtures and other appliances
- Organise clear signage for turning of appliances and other energy-saving actions
- Think about how energy is used in transport to and from scout events. Are there ways to carpool, use public transport, ride a bike?
- Organise an information session for all members of the group and/or contact all members of the group with information

### Do

- Install signs
- Hold an education session for whole group to engage them in energy-saving actions
- Plan a camp using public transport

### Review

- Check the amount of energy you are using during a year. Has your plan reduced how much you use? What other things could you do?
- Check in with members to see if they have suggestions for improvement
