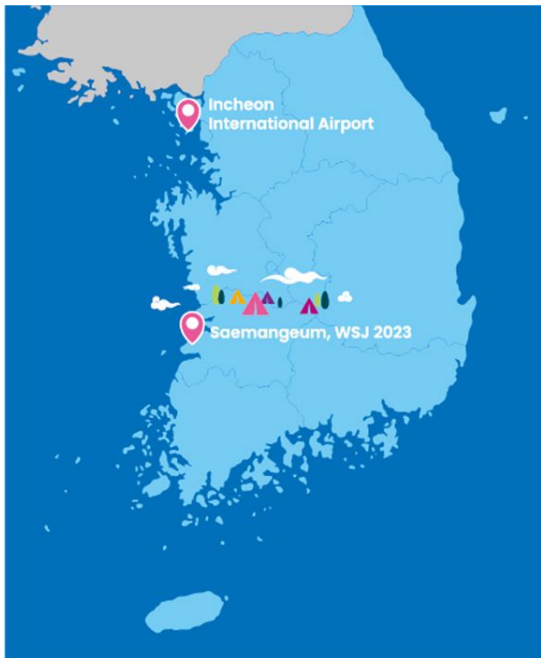

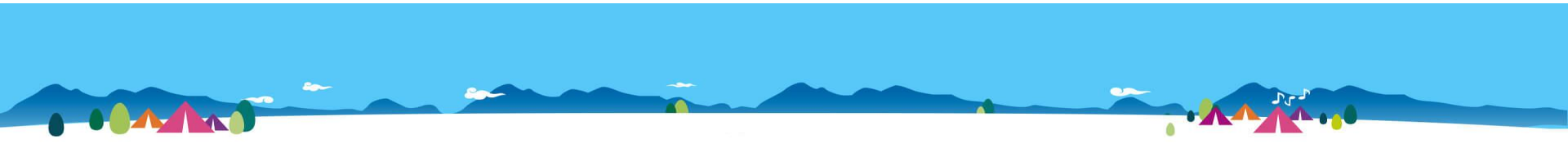

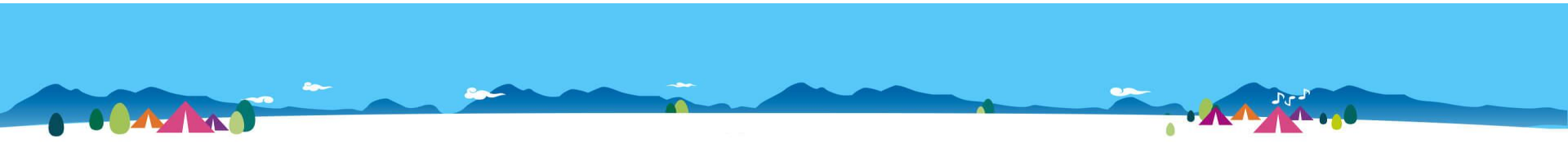

A Unit is made out of:

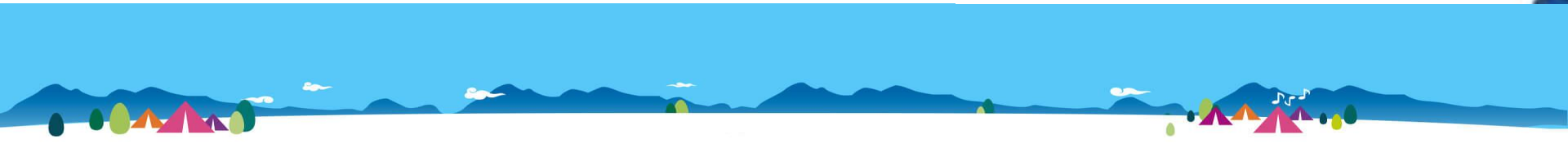
- 36 x Young People (4 Patrols)

- Akubra Hat

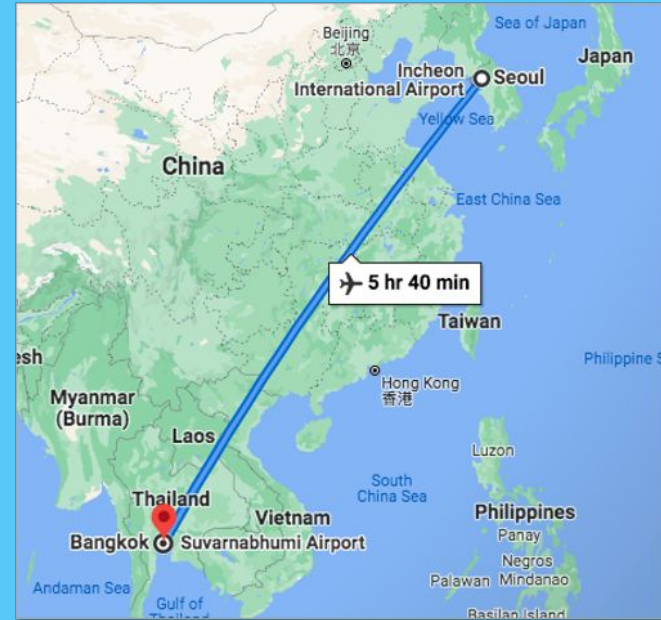

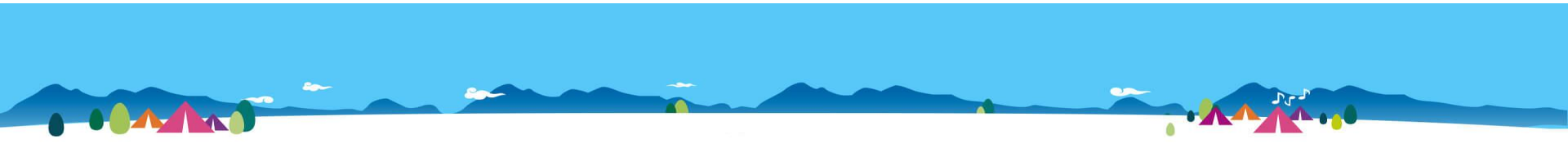

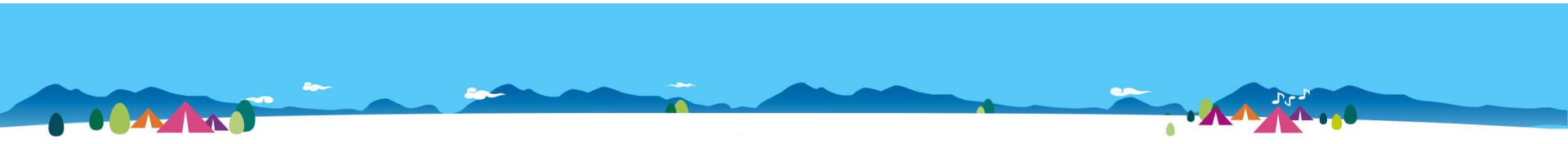
