Why does my role exist?

The Tour Coordinator role exists to manage the delivery of activities, accommodation and transport needs for the optional Post Tour immediately after the 80th New Zealand Rover Moot.

Where do I fit in?

The Tour Coordinator works directly with the Contingent Leader.

How much time is required?

You will be required to commit a significant amount of time for this role. You should expect to spend 2 – 3 hours per week, leading up to the event, and for the wrap up on return to Australia.

Applicants should ensure they have the flexibility in their time to be able to accommodate this significant contribution taking into account their work and study requirements. They should be available during the lead up to and the full duration of the event including post tours.

You will need to be available to leave Australia at the latest of 13 April 2022 and return at the earliest of 24 April 2022.

This is a volunteer position.
