Why does my role exist?

The Assistant Contingent Leader (ACL) role exist to provide personal development opportunities for young adults to support the delivery of a major International Scouting event.

The ACL will work closely with the Contingent Leader (CL) to help manage the delivery of this event and help create the event of a lifetime for hundreds of youth members.

The ACL will provide a youth input to the final itinerary, as well as supporting the delivery of the agreed program.

Where do I fit in?

As an Assistant Contingent Leader, you will report directly to the Contingent Leader. The Contingent Leader will be your mentor to help you grow into this role. This role is to be a bridge between the Youth Members and the Executive.

How much time is required?

You will be required to commit a significant amount of time for this role. You should anticipate approximately 5-10+ hours per week.

Applicants should ensure they have the flexibility in their time to be able to accommodate this significant contribution taking into account their work and study requirements. They should be available during the lead up to and the full duration of the event including pre and post tours. This is a volunteer position.
