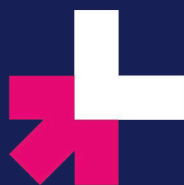
Find an open area that is large enough for all participants to have their own space in different teams.

Do>

1. Divide the participants into random teams. Allow them to name their teams.
 2. Announce an activity such as building a human pyramid or writing out the word "SCOUTS" with their bodies.
 3. Each team will have a different set of rules... one team will be "free" and the other team will be "restricted".
 4. Ask the "restricted" team to complete the same activities in half the time.
- Alternatively, instruct the "restricted" team not to talk while completing the activity whilst the "free" team are allowed to talk.

Review>

1. At the end of the activity, gather the Scouts and invite them to share their experiences.
2. Ask how they felt being in the "free" and "restricted" teams?
3. Was it harder to complete the activity when you were in the "free" team or the "restricted" team?
4. Was this activity fair? Why? Have you ever been treated unfairly?
5. Explain to the Scouts that the rules they were given were like the rules that face different genders in parts of the world.
6. Ask them if they can think of some rules (official or otherwise) that seem to apply mainly to boys or girls. Discuss how it feels to be treated unfairly and work with the Scouts to determine how they can create/maintain a fair and equal Scouting environment.



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
