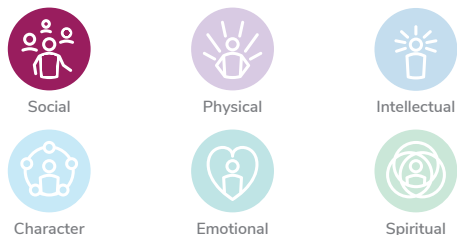
# Messengers of Peace Badge

# Community

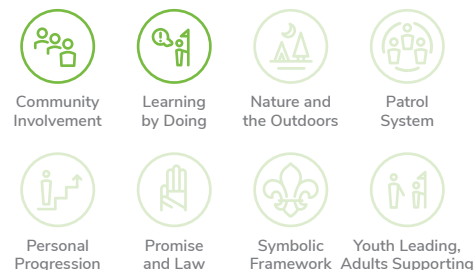
