

Certificate II in Outdoor Recreation



The SIS20419 Certificate II in Outdoor Recreation is a nationally recognised qualification which provides the skills and knowledge for an individual to be competent in performing core skills in outdoor recreation environments and assisting with the conduct of a range of outdoor activities.

Work may be undertaken as part of a team and would be performed under supervision. Work would be undertaken in field locations such as camps or in indoor recreation centers or facilities, in differing environments such as water-based, dry land and mountainous terrains, using a diverse range of equipment.

Typical learning pathways

There are a range of potential learning pathways in Scouts Australia that provide learning and experiences that align to the requirements of the Certificate II in Outdoor Recreation. Youth Members operating on the New Youth Program should be referred to their BC VET for further information about their pathways.

- Venturer Scouts and Rover Scouts engaging in the outdoor adventure skills part of the youth program can use these experience as evidence towards this qualification.
- Adult members may use components of the adult training and their experiences as evidence towards this qualification.

Assessment



Members of Scouts Australia do not incur additional costs to complete a qualification. Anyone who has sufficient evidence can apply for a Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) assessment.

After enrolling you will;

1. Need to provide copies of the evidence that you are using for your RPL assessment.
2. After evidence is provided an Assessor will be assigned who will assess your evidence and work with you to address any gaps against the requirements of the qualification.

Venturer Scouts and Rover Scouts gain a range of experiences and outcomes from Scouting that may contribute evidence towards the Certificate II in Outdoor Recreation. Your Assessor will need to be able to view your portfolio of evidence either physically or electronically.

Additional evidence which may be requested

- Copies of outdoor adventure skills outcomes and supporting evidence
- A logbook of adventurous activities that can be verified by other people
- Letter of recommendation or activity observation from an adult member who supported you to achieve the outdoor adventure skills
- Copies of existing qualifications
- Providing a copy of your Resume or Curriculum Vitae is usually very beneficial.
- RPL Assessment Tool Kit. If required this will be provided by your Branch Commissioner for Vocational Education and Training (VET) or your Assessor

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Adult members have a range of experiences and outcomes from Scouting and elsewhere in your life which may contribute evidence towards the Certificate II in Outdoor Recreation. Your Assessor will need to be able to view your portfolio of evidence either physically or electronically.

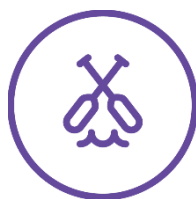
Additional evidence which may be requested

- Adventurous activities work books
- Activity observation / recommendation from an appointed activity Guide or training team member
- Copies of existing qualifications
- Providing a copy of your Resume or Curriculum Vitae is usually very beneficial.
- RPL Assessment Tool Kit. If required this will be provided by your Branch Commissioner for Vocational Education and Training (VET) or your Assessor

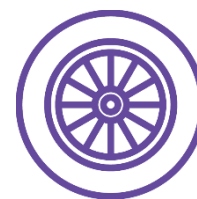
Certificate II in Outdoor Recreation: Potential outcomes

Members of Scouts Australia may have evidence against more than one Scouting learning pathway that is aligned to the Certificate II in Outdoor Recreation.

- The qualification requires eleven (11) units of competency. Four (4) required core and seven (7) elective units of competency.
- Based on your learning and experiences, a broad range of outdoor adventurous activities can be included in the Certificate II in Outdoor Recreation.
 - A maximum of four (4) external electives can be included.
 - Units of competency from the Certificate III in Outdoor Leadership can be used as external electives
