The information in this document will help you understand the Scouting pathways to achieve the Certificate IV in Project Management Practice from the Scouts Australia Institute of Training (RTO 5443).

The information will assist:

- Rover Scouts and Rover Advisors
- Adults in Scouting who support the program in a broad range of roles and responsibilities

BSB40920 Certificate IV in Project Management Practice

This qualification reflects the role of individuals who apply project management skills and knowledge in a wide variety of contexts. The job roles that relate to this qualification may include Contracts Officer, Project Administrator and Quality Officer.

Individuals in these roles work autonomously, and might be members of a project team, with no direct responsibility for overall project outcomes. Primarily, these roles would support wider project operations. They may use project tools and methodologies selectively to support organisational or business activities.

Learning Pathways

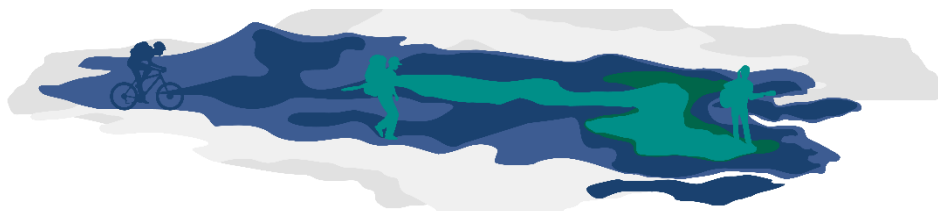
Scouting pathway:

- Have at least twelve (12) months Scouting experience and completed the relevant learning pathway.
- Complete Wood Badge training program to the minimum of receiving;
 - Certificate of Proficiency, and
 - Gilwell woggle
- Engaged in active contributions of project management in the leadership of at least two (2) major Scouting projects or events such as:
 - Gang Show or Showtime.
 - Branch Cuboree, Jamboree, Venture or Moot.
 - Other significant regional or Branch events.

Note for Rover Scouts

Rover Scouts may ask why Wood Badge training is required when they are participants in the youth program.

- Rover Scouts are both participants in the youth program and have legal responsibilities as adults.
- Leadership roles in almost all of the example projects and events places Rover Scouts and adult supporters in a context of choosing to take on adult responsibilities and all adults in Scouting have to adhere to the policies for adults in Scouting.
- As a Rover Scout participating in the youth program it is possible to meet many policy requirements without completing Wood Badge training yet your intimate knowledge of participating in the youth program will assist the other adults doing the same training and meanwhile you benefit from the learning available and broaden your network.



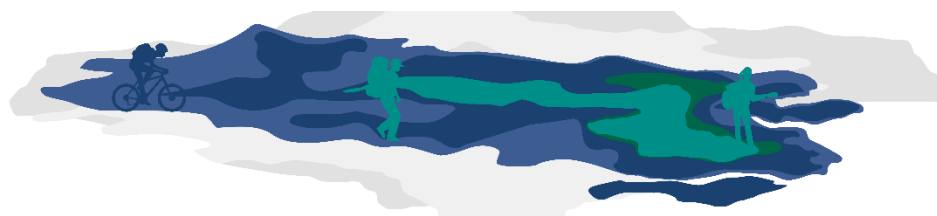
Qualification packaging

The Certificate IV in Project Management Practice requires the completion of nine (9) units of competency:

- 3 core units, plus
- 6 elective units, of which:
 - 3 elective units must be selected from Group A
 - the remaining 3 elective units may be selected from the listed electives or from any Certificate IV or higher qualification
