BSB50820 Diploma of Project Management

This qualification reflects the role of individuals who apply project management skills and knowledge in a variety of contexts, across a number of industry sectors. The job roles that relate to this qualification may include Project Manager and Project Team Leader.

Individuals in these roles have project leadership and management roles and are responsible for achieving project objectives. They possess a sound theoretical knowledge base and use a range of specialised, technical and managerial competencies to initiate, plan, execute and evaluate their own work and/or the work of others.

Learning Pathways

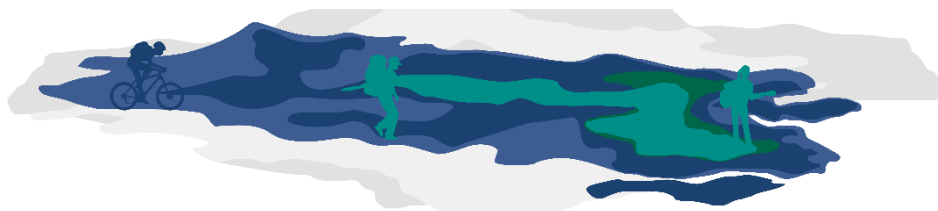
Scouting pathway:

- Have at least twelve (12) months Scouting experience and completed the relevant learning pathway.
- Complete Wood Badge training program, Scouting Leadership receiving;
 - Wood Badge (wood beads) and Parchment
 - International membership of 1st Gilwell Park Scout Group evidenced by the issuing of the Gilwell Scarf
- Engaged in the leadership and management of at least two (2) complex Scouting projects or events such as:
 - National Jamboree, Venture, or Moot.
 - International Contingents.
 - Other significant national or international events.

Assessment

Your Assessor will need to be able to view your portfolio of evidence either physically or preferably a digital copy.

- Copies of work you have completed which aligns to the requirements of the selected units of competency.
- A copy of your Axe & Log Scouting modules
 - Scouting Proficiency Fundamentals
 - Scouting Proficiency Programming
- Providing a copy of your Resume or Curriculum Vitae is usually very beneficial
- Letters of recommendation or reference
- Copies of existing qualifications
- RPL Assessment Tool Kit. If required, this will be provided by your Branch Commissioner for Vocational Education and Training (BC VET) or your Assessor



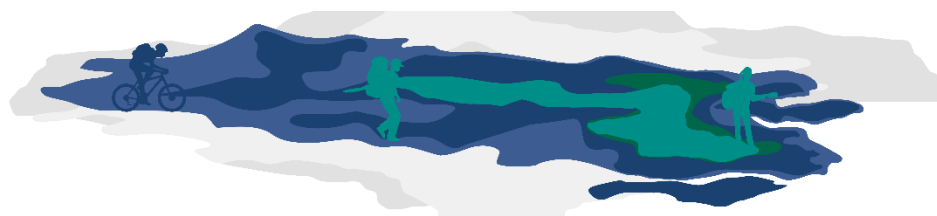
Qualification packaging

The Diploma of Project Management requires the completion of twelve (12) units of competency:

- 8 core units plus
- 4 elective units, of which:
 - 2 elective units must be selected from the listed electives
- for the remaining 2 elective units, they may be selected from the listed electives or from any current training package at Diploma or above.
