Venturer Scouts: Qualifications and Secondary School Certificates of Education

SIS20419 Certificate II in Outdoor Recreation

This information kit will help you understand the qualifications available from the Scouts Australia Institute of Training (RTO 5443) to Venturer Scouts (14-18 year olds) and how these can be incorporated into your secondary school certificate of education (e.g. HSC, VCE, etc.).

SIS20419 Certificate II in Outdoor Recreation

The Certificate II in Outdoor Recreation reflects the role of individuals who assist with operational logistics and the delivery of recreational activities. They work under direct supervision and with guidance from those responsible for planning, finalising and delivering activities, including program managers and leaders.

Assistants use a range of fundamental activity techniques during activities and can work in indoor and outdoor recreation environments, adventure learning centers or camps. The combined skills and knowledge provided by this qualification do not provide for a job outcome as a leader and further training would be required before moving into those roles. This qualification provides a pathway to work for any type of organisation that delivers outdoor recreation activities including commercial, not-for-profit and government organisations.

Learning Pathways

To achieve the Certificate II in Outdoor Recreation as a Venturer Scout in a manner that you can use this qualification as a part of your secondary school certificate of education you will need to;

- Have at least six (6) months Scouting experience.
- Maintain an up-to-date, verifiable activities log
- Complete the Scouts Australia on-demand learning, Work Skills for Recreation.
- Complete Stage 5 Outdoor Adventure Skills in all three (3) Core activity streams, Bushwalking, Camping and Bushcraft - Survival Skills.
- Complete Stage 5 in at least one additional activity stream from the Outdoor Adventure Skills.
- Have logged at least 10 days of participation or assisting in conducting outdoor recreation activities.

Work Placements

Within the context of Vocational Education and Training connected to school outcomes, structured workplace learning alternatively known as work placement requires students to participate in experiences where they are applying the skills and knowledge. Venturer Scouts attend meetings with their local Venturer unit for two (2) hours every week and they participate in a range of activities depending on their interest areas, equivalent to at least one weekend every month.

Logbook


The outdoor adventure skills part of the youth program includes a logbook. It is very important to record all of your outdoor adventures in your logbook for three (3) reasons:

- A logbook is a key piece of evidence when completing outdoor qualifications.
- Both Scouting and the broader outdoors industry rely on logbooks to demonstrate you are staying current in those activities.
- Participating in Scouting you will often do far more trips in any activity than will be evident to your assessor if they are only looking at what stages you have completed in the outdoor adventure skills.

Learning and Assessment

There are two ways Venturer Scouts typically complete qualifications via the Scouts Australia Institute of Training:

- If not including qualifications in your secondary school certificate of education you can submit current evidence at any time that you are a member of Scouting. While you are at school, after you have left school, while you are a Venturer Scout or after moving into Rover Scouts. You are assessed on the evidence you have provided and if there is not enough evidence the assessor may ask you to provide other suitable evidence which may or may not include the on-demand learning.
- When completing a Vocational Education and Training qualification connected to school outcomes you **must complete** this within a specified time frame. The use of the on-demand learning and the <u>Field Book for Australian Scouting</u> provide you with learning materials that assist you to complete the qualification/s within the limited timeframe you have to ensure that they are included in your secondary school certificate of education.



State and Territory VET for Schools requirements

Each Australian state and territory has their own department of education with differing requirements for how they manage vocational education and training qualifications that were completed outside of the school.


- Some States and Territories require specific elective units of competency that either must or must not be included as a part of the qualification.
- Different administrative systems are used to record completion of qualifications.
- There are different requirements for what date final submissions must be made by.

States and Territories that enable the full use of the qualification packaging rules specified above and do not require any modification include.

- Australian Capital Territory (ACT)
- Northern Territory (NT)
- Queensland (QLD)
- South Australia (SA)
- Tasmania (TAS)
- Western Australia (WA)

States and Territories that specify different criteria to the qualification packaging rules are listed below and detailed on the following pages.

- New South Wales (NSW)
 - attempt all core units of competency (totalling 55 HSC indicative hours) and elective units of competency to a minimum of 125 HSC indicative hours and to meet qualification packaging rules
 - complete a minimum of 35 hours of mandatory work placement per year (70 hours for a two year program).
- Victoria (VIC)
 - attempt all core units of competency (totalling 118 VCE nominal hours) plus elective units of competency (totalling a minimum of 70 VCE nominal hours) and to meet qualification packaging rules
 - SISXEMR001 Respond to emergency situations, is a compulsory unit of competency
 - undertake a minimum of 80 hours (equivalent to 10 days of work) in an outdoor recreation industry placement
