Little Sparks, Big Ideas

Joey Scout & Cub Scout Units

Big ideas start small – let's hear what your Joey Scouts or Cub Scouts think of their program and personal progression! Lead this interactive game as part of a Unit night and share what you see or hear.

Aim: To understand the extent to which Joey Scouts and/or Cub Scouts are engaging with the Achievement Pathways and understand how to complete achievements.

Time required: 15 mins

Equipment/resources: At least two adult volunteers are needed to facilitate this activity. Record responses using either a printout of this document or a device.

Instructions:

- This activity follows a similar structure to the game North South East West, where youth members move to different walls within the hall in response to a question.
- An adult calls out a question and youth members run to the wall which best reflects their response. Allocate three walls: yes (left), maybe (back), no (right).
- Once youth members have moved to their wall count how many youth members are in each group and record these numbers.
- Then ask the follow-up questions and record responses from 2-3 members before moving onto the next question. If you have enough adults, ask the questions for the 'yes', 'maybe' and 'no' groups simultaneously to keep the game moving more quickly.
- Aim to get a variety of responses from different youth members throughout the activity.
