Scout, Venturer Scout & Rover Scout Units

Unpack your program, share your thoughts, and have your voice heard on how the Achievement Pathways can work better for you and your Unit. Lead this conversation as part of a Unit night and then submit your responses.

Overview: Scouts Australia is currently gathering feedback on experiences delivering the program and engaging with the Achievement Pathways. Our goal is to hear from as many Units as possible across Australia, so that we can understand what is working well and what needs improving. We want to hear from all members of your Unit in this process, as all feedback – good and bad – helps us to continue to improve the Achievement Pathways.

This discussion guide can be used in a few different ways, depending on what works best for your Unit and age section:

- For smaller Units, you could sit the whole Unit down and discuss the questions together
- For medium-sized Units, you could consider completing one part per week over three weeks and compiling the results together
- For larger Units, you might like to split into Patrols and give one part of the discussion guide to each Patrol, with everyone coming back together at the end to share their findings

If you run this activity across multiple Patrols within your Unit, please combine the results into one submission when you enter your feedback. For questions where you can only select one answer, please choose the one that represents the majority view of your Unit.

This is a great chance for members of your Unit Council to experience leading informal discussions as well, so make sure they are involved. Your adult Leaders are a great supporting resource if you are unsure about where to start.

Time required: About 30 mins. It's ok if your Unit takes a little longer or gets through it a little quicker. You could break up the activity with a game between each part or incorporate some physical movement – be creative!
